In furtherance of your advisory opinion request on behalf of Mad Dog PAC, kindly confirm or correct the following:

- <!--[if !supportLists]-->1. <!--[endif]-->Mad Dog PAC (the "Committee") will screen potential purchasers of the Committee's t-shirts to determine that the purchase price, when aggregated with all other contributions made to the Committee by such potential purchasers, does not exceed that purchaser's contribution limit.
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->2. <!--[endif]-->If the Committee determines that a potential purchaser's purchase would exceed that person's contribution limit, the Committee will either reject the sale or refund to the purchaser the amount by which the purchase would cause the purchaser to exceed the contribution limit.
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->3. <!--[endif]-->For all t-shirt sales, the Committee will aggregate the purchase price with all other purchases and contributions made to the Committee by each purchaser to determine whether the aggregate amount requires the Committee to report it as a contribution on its disclosure reports filed with the Commission.
- <!--[if !supportLists]-->4. <!--[endif]-->The Committee's webpage that provides information regarding the t-shirts for sale will inform potential purchasers that the images on the t-shirts have not been authorized by any candidate or their authorized committees.
