On April 22, 2019, I received a letter from the Federal Election Commission (FEC) dated April 18, 2019. The letter informed me that the FEC received a complaint that indicates the Committee to Elect Stephen Dwight may have violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971.

The alleged violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 by the Committee to Elect Stephen Dwight is denied.

Please maintain confidentiality in accordance with 52 U.S.C. §30109(a)(4)(B) and §30109(a)(12)(A).

Please be advised that I do not hold a federally-elected office and have never been a candidate for a federally-elected office. Upon information and belief, a \$500.00 campaign contribution was allegedly made by Enbridge-DCP PAC, 5400 Westheimer Court, Houston, TX 77056, to the Committee To Elect Stephen Dwight. Upon information and belief, Enbridge-DCP PAC is a duly-organized political action committee with a principle place of business in Houston, TX. Upon information and belief, all of the contributors to the Enbridge-DCP PAC are United States citizens. Upon information and belief, Brian Fahrenthold, who allegedly delivered the campaign contribution to the Committee to Elect Stephen Dwight, is a lobbyist registered with the Louisiana Board of Ethics (03/08/2017 – current). The Committee to Elect Stephen Dwight does not have any record of receiving such contribution.
