On April 18, 2019, the Federal Election Commission ("Commission") notified your clients, Committee to Elect Bob Wooley, Committee to Elect David Gallegos, Committee to Elect Greg Nibert, Committee to Elect Nate Gentry, Committee to Re-Elect Candy Spence Ezzell, Committee to Re-Elect Jim Townsend, Committee to Re-Elect Larry Scott, and Committee to Re-Elect Rodd Montoya, of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act").

On July 2, 2020, based upon the information contained in the complaint and information provided by respondents, the Commission found no reason to believe that your clients violated 52 U.S.C. § 30121(a)(2). Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons explaining the basis for the Commission's decision is enclosed.
